

# ACTING CEO'S REPORT

2015-16 was a year of growth for Volunteering and Contact ACT (VCA). VCA continued to increase its active-link reach of services to the Canberra region - linking people to the information and services and linking volunteers and volunteer-involving organisations.

VCA rolled out new services and membership packages so VCA now offers membership benefits in both the volunteering and community information programs. Internally, to enable work flexibility, a common office ICT system was introduced across VCA's sites.

Over the course of the year all the major projects the organisation set out to achieve were successfully completed.

The following were particular highlights:

- The 2015 Volunteering EXPO, in September, at which 57 organisations engaged more than 1,200 prospective volunteers.
- Hosting the 2016 National Volunteering Conference in April.
   More than 700 delegates from across Australia looked at innovation, leadership and building a strong community future through volunteering.
- The ACT Community Directory, a user-friendly online portal for reliable, accessible and up-to-date community information for the Canberra Region was launched in October. The directory contains information on more than 1500 organisations in Canberra.

The successes of this year have come about due to VCA's capable staff, who have been led by Sarah Wilson, Manager, Volunteering and Inclusive Services, and Jean Giese, Manager, Community Information Services. It was also a year in which VCA embedded the new, united organisation into the Canberra landscape. This would not have been possible, without ongoing support from our supporters and partners. VCA is sincerely grateful to the Canberra Labor Club Group who provide our office space on City Walk, Beyond Bank Australia for sponsoring the ACT Volunteer of the Year Awards, Volunteering EXPO and Quarterly Forums for Volunteer Managers, and also to The Snow Foundation for their generous support to the Inclusive Volunteering Program.

# ACHIEVEMENTS AGAINST MISSION STATEMENT

## Providing access to reliable information

VCA is committed to providing accessible, reliable and up-to-date community information to everyone. It is essential to embrace the possibilities of technology to benefit the community and connect people to appropriate services. The ACT Community Directory enables a single platform for the sharing of high quality data on services in the ACT and region.

The ACT Community Directory contains information about 1525 organisations, delivering 2531 services across the ACT and region.

The CONTACT Canberra shopfront, info line and email address assisted with accurate and appropriate referrals on 6195 occasions.

### **Access City**

During the year the Access City Hotline received 103 calls. Of these, 59% were requests for information and 41% were access issues. Every request that came through the Hotline was successfully resolved. Any ongoing advocacy cases were referred to alternative supports following the closure of Access City in mid-2016.

# Being an active link between people, government, and non-government organisations

CONTACT Canberra linked members of the community with key services through representatives of external organisations having a presence within the shopfront environment. These included the Australian Tax Office offering Tax Help support to low income earners, the National Disability Insurance Agency engaging in Community Conversations and a regular Justice of the Peace service.

# 2016 National Volunteering Conference

In April 2016 VCA hosted the 2016 National Volunteering Conference, in partnership with Volunteering Australia. Themed 'Build the Future' the conference welcomed 700 delegates, who heard from five keynote addresses, 39 presentations, 14 workshops and one panel. Over the course of the three-day Conference attendees built knowledge, leadership, networks, and innovation.

### Volunteering EXPO

In September 2015 VCA hosted the biennial Volunteering EXPO. The EXPO featured 57 exhibitors who showcased their volunteering programs to the public. More than 1200 people came through the doors of the EXPO to find out how to enrich their lives through volunteering. The EXPO was sponsored by VCA's Community Partner

# The Inclusive Volunteering Program

In 2015-16 the IVP received 55 referrals and facilitated 34 inclusive placements with member organisations. The Program produced 'Building Inclusive Bridges', a document which assists people with facilitating inclusive referrals.

The IVP ceased operations at the end of the financial year due to a discontinuation of funding. Since its inception in 2012 the Program facilitated 101 inclusive placements.







#### Connections

In 2015-16 the Connections Program facilitated 31 supported friendships between mental health consumers and appropriately screened and trained volunteers. Fifty five referrals were received for prospective participants and 38 volunteers were accepted onto the Program.

In early 2016 Connections was the only mental health program in the ACT granted funding for the transition year before being eligible to apply for funding under the NDIS.

#### ACT Volunteer of the Year Awards

Sponsored by Beyond Bank, the awards recognised eight individual volunteers and six volunteer teams for their outstanding contribution to the Canberra region. Jeanette Purkis, a passionate advocate for people with Autism, was awarded the ACT Volunteer of the Year and Arthritis ACT Warm Water Exercise team received the Team Award.


### Fostering a Culture of Giving: Volunteering and the Australian Curriculum

During National Student Volunteer Week 2015, Volunteering ACT launched a suite of resources for Foundation to Year 10 teachers that aligns volunteering with the Australian curriculum.

The resources show how principles and practices in volunteering can be embedded into everyday classroom activity. The resources were launched by Associate Professor Dr Thomas Nielsen, a strong advocate for a 'Curriculum of Giving'.

## Be Prepared: Managing volunteers in an Emergency

Under the Natural Disaster Resilience Program, VCA undertook research on managing trained and spontaneous volunteers in an emergency. Consultations were held with ten volunteer involving organisations that have designated responsibilities in an emergency ACT Community Recovery Plan. The resulting product is a practical guide on how to manage both trained and spontaneous volunteers in an emergency.

## Cameron Lynch

Volunteering and Contact ACT completed its first full year of operations as a corporate entity and achieved significant financial success - a surplus of \$209,167. This was achieved through:

- the management of the 2016 National Volunteering Conference on behalf of Volunteering Australia
- additional grant income being obtained for various projects as well as the provision of ongoing services
- the containment of ongoing expenses to ensure value for money is achieved, and
- an overall increase in activity across the organisation as reflected in the turnover exceeding \$2 million for the financial year.

The financial position has improved as a result of the outcomes achieved and it is pleasing to report that retained earnings are now just under \$0.5 million. This places the company on a solid financial foundation from which it can pursue its strategic objectives.
